Administration of Medication

Education Queensland requires parents/carers to undertake the following in relation to the administration of medication and/or management of health conditions.

For medication to be administered at school or during school related activities, there must be a formal letter from the medical practitioner for the student to have the medication.

The medication must be in its original container with a pharmacy label with both the student's and doctor's name on it. Medication without its original container **WILL NOT** be accepted by staff.

A "Consent to Administer Medication" **Form MUST** be completed prior to the commencement of the medication being taken. **Parents MUST notify** our school in writing when a change of dosage is required. This instruction MUST be accompanied by a letter from the medical practitioner.

Parents MUST advise our school in writing and collect the medication when it is no longer required at school. All medications must be collected at the end of Term 4.

Only medication prescribed by a doctor or dentist may be administered to students by school staff.

PBL = Safe, Supportive and Disciplined School Environment

Tiaro State School strives to create a safe, supportive and discipline school environment where the focus is on learning. To achieve this, students, staff and families are required to be actively involved.

Behaviour at Tiaro State School is managed as outlined in the school's <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>.

Our school expectations:

- Be Safe
- Be a Responsible
- Be Respectful

These expectations are for all students, staff and families. These expectations are displayed throughout the school, in each learning environment and discussed daily.

Behaviour that does not match the school expectations may result in a student being referred to the 'Reflection Room'.

These referrals are learning opportunities for students to work with staff to reflect on their behaviour, and create a plan to display behaviour that follows the school rules. Families are informed via phone call if their child is referred twice in one day.

Appropriate School Games

Play time, and social development, is a valuable part of growing up. Learning to take turns, accepting 'getting out',

dealing with disappointment, accepting others and even negotiating and following rules are important social and emotional skills for children to learn.

Games at school need to be safe for everyone. I encourage parents to ask their child about the games that they play at school, and how they games went. If your child is unable to tell you about their playtime games, or they seem to state that there are regular problems, this may be a sign to contact the school to discuss the matter.

Welcome to our new friends and welcome back to our old friends. Term 1 is already well underway.



Workplace Health and Safety

School Staff

Educational staff have the right to disconnect from work. This means that emails and messages will not be answered (unless urgent) before 8am or after 4pm Monday to Friday. We encourage our staff to disconnect all weekend.

Hand Sanitiser

Please continue to use hand sanitiser on entering the school.

In the classroom we actively promote the use of soap and water for handwashing as this is more effective and less hazardous.

Sun Safety



Note: sun-safe hats are the preferred hat option. CAPS are not permitted to be used. Tiaro State School supplies SPF 30 or higher broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen for students to use.

Head Lice

Head lice have been detected in the school. The parents of all students it is extremely important for you to check your child's head for head lice TODAY.

If you do find head lice, commence treatment immediately and be sure to complete the process of treatment. This will help prevent head lice from spreading.

Remember to keep checking your family member's heads every 2 days until there are no head lice found for 10 consecutive days.

Stand up for Safety and set a safe pace at school

Parents and Care Givers stick to the 40km/h speed limit in school zones and set an example for the pace around your school.

Road User Messages – Bicycle Riders

- Wear your helmet correctly
- Keep your mind on your riding.
- Be aware- Ride with care.
- Walk your bike in school grounds.
- Walk your bike to the end of the carpark.
- Walk your bike across the pedestrian lights on the highway.
