PBL Shop

Wellness Wednesday

As part of our PBL journey the staff decided to implement Wellness Wednesday for the students. This will take place on Wednesday the 17th May. Students will have the opportunity to step out of the classroom, have some fun, relax and prepare themselves for the second half of the term. Fortnightly Focus

Every fortnight starting on a Monday we introduce a new fortnightly focus. We use the focus to help the students to be conscious of certain behaviours in order to improve them. We use the fortnight to talk about the focus and the importance of following the focus. The focus this fortnight is:

'Walk in and around the school buildings and be in the right place at the right time.'

Fortnightly Parade

Fortnightly parade is held in week 2,4,6 & 8 on Friday at 2:30pm. It is during these parades that students are presented with academic certificates. Families of our PBL champions will be emailed prior to the parade notifying you when your child will be receiving a certificate.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across a school and helps schools develop safe and supportive learning environments.

Our school expectations:

- Be Safe
- Be Responsible
- Be Respectful

The PBL framework supports schools to become traumainformed by increasing awareness of the effects of trauma on students' learning, wellbeing and behaviour, including attendance, engagement, relationships with others, academic achievement and behaviour. This awareness includes being mindful of avoiding re-traumatisation and looking beyond the immediate or 'surface' behaviours. The staff at Tiaro State School are trained on Trauma Informed Practises. This allows us to know what to look for with students that may have experienced trauma in their lives.
